National States Geographic Information Council (NSGIC) Report

Larry Zink talked about highlights from the NSGIC meeting. There was a presentation on model laws for surveyors. Various states base their laws on this model. Larry felt that this issue dovetails into GIS professional requirements that the board has discussed in the past. He told us about the Federal budget office and how it is looking intently at GIS as a tool to help how the office spreads money across the country. Larry also informed the board that the Western Governors' Association has passed a resolution to step up coordination on cadastral projects.

Bill Sheldon from Windstone Inc. and Marcus Tooze from GIS Workshop Inc. will be presenting at the November 9th forum. The forum is scheduled for 11:45 am at the east campus student union.
