High-Resolution National Hydrography Dataset (NHD)

- Remapping of Nebraska's surface features essentially complete
- NHD an intelligent database design for analyzing and addressing surface water features
- Demos & Training available - NDNR
- NHD referencing assistance available – NDNR
- Maintenance & enhancement feedback welcome

Statewide Imagery Update

- Based on 2003 1-meter, true color, leaf-on FSA NAIP imagery
- Acquisition supported by nine agencies: NDOR, NDNR, NDEQ, NSSO, NPAT, NEMA, NPPD, MAPA, NARD
- Imagery expected to be available around July 2007

NI-ROC Collaborative High-Resolution Imagery Acquisition

- 6-inch imagery
- Seven NE-IA counties in Omaha/Lincoln area
- Five other cities: Kearney, Grand Island, Columbus, Norfolk, and Nebraska City
- 12-inch imagery
- Five other counties: Buffalo, Adams, Madison, Dodge, Saunders
- Tremendous cost-savings through pooling demand and resources
- Approx. 8,000 square miles
- Partners: numerous cities, counties, state and local agencies, NRDS, and USGS
- Lead by Mike Schonlau, Omaha/Douglas County GIS Coordinator, and Eric Herbert, Sarpy County GIS Coordinator and MAPA
- Complements statewide 1-meter, leaf-on imagery through FSA
- Periodic updates planned
